

Founded in the mid-1920s as a modest 32-page pamphlet with a \$150 budget, World Literature Today kicks off its 100th year of continuous publication in 2026. Fostering international cultural exchange, this renowned publication—based at the University of Oklahoma—hails from a crossroads of cultures on the Southern Plains and is a testament to the transformative power of literature.

As of 2026, WLT has built up a global base of subscribers while consistently elevating voices from around the world and fostering deep engagement with literature's role in cultural understanding.

WLT keeps a finger on the cultural pulse of the globe, serving as an indispensable index to contemporary international literature. More than 2.2 million annual readers engage with WLT's content, representing 300 percent growth in the past decade. According to a 2024 readership survey, 95% of respondents said they were "very" (82%) or "somewhat" (19%) satisfied with WLT.



As the centerpiece of the centennial, in February 2026 Restless Books will publish the anthology *A Compass on the Navigable Sea*: 100 *Years of World Literature*. Compiled by *WLT* editor in chief Daniel Simon, with a foreword by Pico Iyer, the book will feature more than 130 essays, book reviews, interviews, poems, and stories that have appeared in the magazine since its founding. A national marketing campaign will include various launch events around the country, and "The Art of the Literary Magazine," an exhibition of the top 10 covers of *WLT* in the past 50 years, will open at the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art in fall 2026.

WLT will publish a marquee centennial issue in September 2026, with a commissioned illustration on the cover, plus highlights from the first 100 years and a variety of special features inside.




WLT's readers are adults of all ages. The highest percentage are 45-64 years old.






LITERARY & CULTURAL EXPERIENCES




